Groundhog Day Friday, February 2

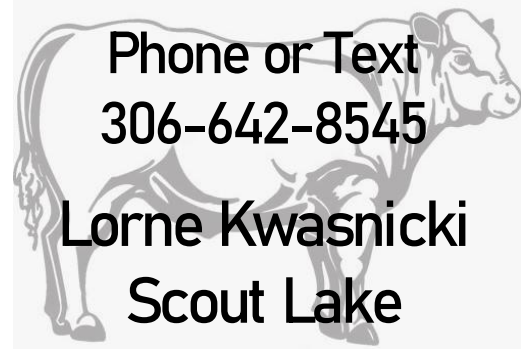

BUSINESS LICENSES

Anyone that had a 2023 Business License is required to renew this license for the January 1- December 31, calendar year. If your business will not be in operation in 2024, please advise the Town Office.

Dog Licenses



2024 dog licenses are available at the Town Office. Bylaw No. 1-11 requires **ALL** dogs within Town Limits to be licensed. The annual fee for a dog is \$10.00. If your dog is un-neutered or un-spade the cost of the license is \$150.00 per dog until proof of neuter and or spade.

Cat Licenses

2024 cat licenses are available at the Town Office. Bylaw No. 2-14 requires **ALL** cats within Town limits to be licensed. The annual fee for a cat license are as follows:

SNOW REMOVAL

When clearing your driveway or walkway, the snow removed should be placed on your own personal property and not on the neighboring property or Town property, this includes the street, unless you have been given permission by the property owner. Also, we ask that all residents and commercial property owners/occupants to clear sidewalks within 24 hours of snowfall.

FLUSHING BABY WIPES/ADULT WIPES

Again, we are requesting PLEASE DO NOT FLUSH THESE WIPES!!!

NOTICE: It has been brought to the attention of the Town Office that residents are flushing Baby Wipes/Adult Wipes and causing issues with in the lift station. Although these wipes claim that they are flushable they are not biodegradable and are filling the basket at the landfill. Council is asking that you **DO NOT** flush these products down your toilets.

Recycling Cardboard

The Town of Rockglen has recycle bins, for Town use, if you're renovating or have purchased large items in boxes too big to fit in your residential blue bin. Please call the Office (306) 476-2144 during regular business hours to make arrangements to place your broke down cardboard in these bins.

To the concerned residents of Rockglen regarding the Centre Street streetscapes project.

While the Town understands the concerns of the residents, we are striving to do this project with the funding provided with the grants received. Town Council is working on all options to make sure this project is not a tax burden on our residents. The Town of Rockglen received these funds as a grant from Prairies Canada. The project costs are now substantially more than when the original project was placed out for tender 3 years ago. Council than proceeded to revise the design due to the higher costs and to work within the funding. Council decided to narrow the road and sidewalks and add greenspace to cut costs. Green spaces whether it be flowers, garbage cans/and or benches will strive to lift the appeal of the downtown and help with economic development to draw people to the community. We have a large number of residents who work hard to bring tourists to the area. Tourists enjoy communities that look pleasant. As for the parallel and angle parking, council decided to have angle parking on the south side of the street as it's the busiest, and parallel parking on the north side. In front of the Drop-in Centre there will still be disabled parking available, as well as slopped curb access. Currently, the side walk is approximately 12 feet wide. We are looking at cutting it back to save costs. Adding green space will not only enhance the beauty of our Centre Street, it will eliminate concrete which will in turn save money.

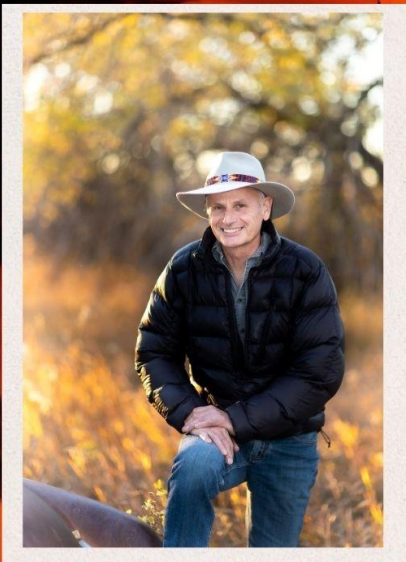
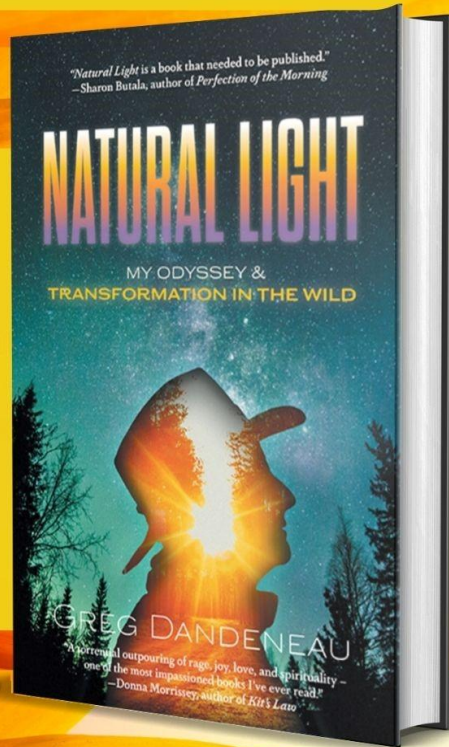

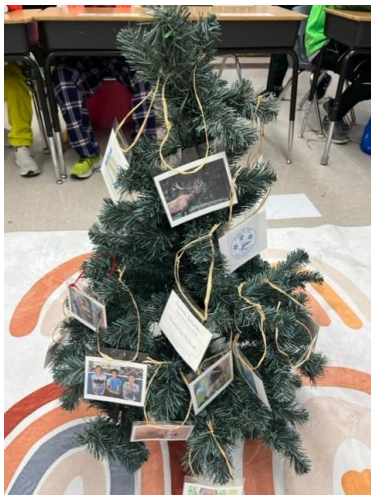
